## AEJM CURATORIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The Association of European Jewish Museums aims to promote cooperation and communication between Jewish museums in Europe and to assist members in meeting the challenges facing Jewish museums today. It encourages the exchange of information and ideas among European Jewish museums, provides training and learning opportunities and promotes mutual support and cooperation in a wide range of areas.

The professional training and development of curatorial staff plays a key role within the AEJM's mission to assist members in meeting the challenges of today. The AEJM therefore plans to offer an annual Curatorial Education Programme, to be held in different European Jewish Museums in cooperation with relevant academic institutions. The training courses will focus on vital aspects of curatorial work: the identification and documentation of Judaica, the development of conservation, research tools and skills, interpretation and educational aspects of Judaica.

The first Curatorial Education Programme will be held at the Jewish Museum of Vienna, with a five-day programme organised by Chief Curator, Dr. Felicitas Heimann-Jelinek.

The educational programme has been designed to meet the particular needs of curatorial staff. Participation is free of charge to staff members from European Jewish Museums. However, each museum must cover its own travel and accommodation expenses. Since participation is limited and we would like to offer as many institutions as possible the opportunity to send staff members to participate in the programme, each museum will be allowed to send one curator. Requests to send additional curators from the same museum will be put on a waiting list, in case vacancies become available.
