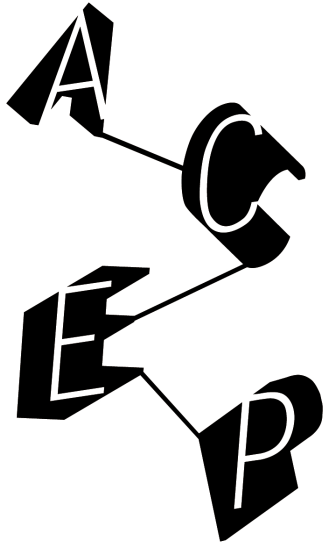

The Advanced Curatorial Education Programme is a joined programme initiative by the Association of European Jewish Museums and the Jewish Museum Berlin and funded by the German Federal Foreign Office. The A-CEP I '16 will focus on:

1. Curating temporary or semi-permanent exhibitions in Jewish museums in Europe
2. Jewish built heritage in the framework of curatorial practice at Jewish museums in Europe
